

Alert and Call to Action for all Registered Dental Hygienists licensed to practice in the Commonwealth of Virginia

In September, the newly installed Virginia Dental Association president, Dr. Cynthia Southern was interviewed for the October/November/December 2022 issue of the Virginia Dental Journal (https://issuu.com/vdapublications/docs/vdj_99.4/38). When asked the question: "Staff shortages are handcuffing the delivery of dental care. What can the VDA, and organized dentistry at large, do to mitigate the problem?", she responded: "One thing we need to look at is allowing assistants to do coronal scaling, that would be a big help".
